This manual details how you, as an employee or student of Maastricht University, can configure the wireless network eduroam (students) or UMnet (employees), on your iPad.

What do you need?

- An iPad that is able to connect to wireless networks.
- An employee or student account of Maastricht University.

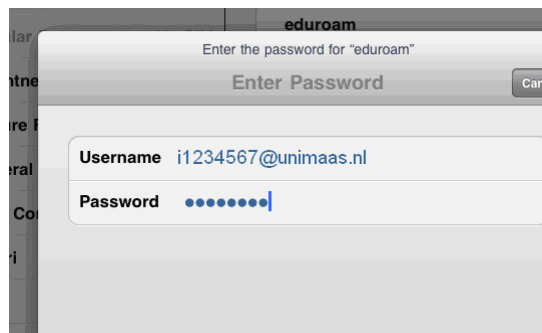
This manual assumes you are making use of an iPad with OS version 4.3.

	<p>Step 1: Select the 'Settings' icon.</p>

Step 3:

A logon screen appears.

Here you need to fill in your user credentials for Maastricht University.

- Employees use their username with @unimaas.nl behind it (e.g. login.name@unimaas.nl)

- Students use their student id with @unimaas.nl behind it (e.g. i1234567@unimaas.nl)

Also fill in the password of your UM-account and click the *Join* key on the keyboard of your iPad.

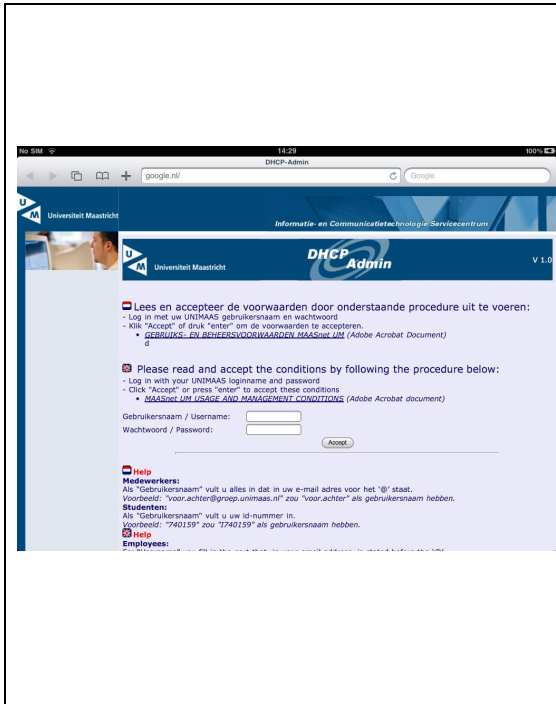


Step 4:

After you clicked 'Join', a certificate message appears.

Accept this certificate by clicking *Accept*.

Your wireless network connection is now configured correctly.

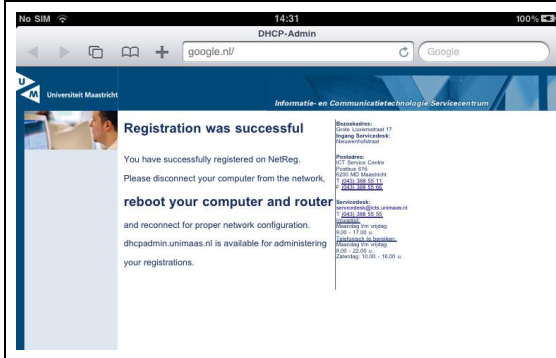


Step 5:

If you never before were connected to the wireless network of Maastricht University on your iPad, you will see a page that displays the Terms of using MAASnet when you start up your browser (Safari).

Read the terms and accept them by filling in your username and password in the required fields and by clicking *Accept*.

Until you accepted the terms, you will make use of a limited connection.



Step 6:

When registration was successful, you will need to restart your iPad (turn it off and on again).

After this you are connected to the wireless network of Maastricht University.
